Community Work Skills assist disadvantaged Queenslanders to gain nationally recognised skills and qualifications up to a Certificate III level.

In addition to receiving your **CPP20617 Certificate II in Cleaning**, you will also be placed in a tailored supportive program catered to your needs as a student. Challenge Employment and Training (RTO number: 5388) deliver specialist Foundation Skills to assist you through your qualification should you require it and ensure you are confident and competent to enter the workforce on completion of the program.

You will have the opportunity to learn and network with our highly trained and motivated supervisors while learning the skills needed to ensure you are job ready. This program has been created to tailor industry requirements.

Benefits of Completing a Certificate II in Cleaning:

This program is designed to teach students how to operate within the workplace. Throughout the program, students will complete hands-on activities to stimulate a real work situation. This qualification will allow participants to gain employment as domestic assistants in the aged care and disability sectors and commercial cleaning.

Benefits of Completing these select units from Certificate III in Individual Support:

Selected units from individual support have been chosen to teach participants how to work within the aged care and disability community. These units will provide skills in:

- Effective communication
- Communication techniques
- Legal and ethical frameworks
- Cultural awareness and safety
- Concepts and definitions of diversity
- Provide First Aid

Please be advised that engagement of Home Care Employees are required to have a minimum Certificate III in Individual Support however, the recruitment of staff to provide domestic support does not require the same level of qualification.

Eligibility

Skilling Queenslanders for Work target young people (15 -24 years), Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people, mature aged job seekers (45+) , people with disabilities, as well as people from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds

More broadly, disadvantaged jobseekers and under-utilised Queensland workers are able to access assistance under SQW. Participants who fall into this category do not have to belong to one of the target groups listed above.

Participants must be:

- Queensland residents
- Aged 15 years or older
- An Australian citizen, Australian permanent resident (includes humanitarian entrant), temporary resident with the necessary visa and work permits on a pathway to permanent residency, or a New Zealand citizen.
